Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$5,378,839 in February, 1947 compared with \$4,753,071 in January, 1947. In February, 1947 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 54 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 33 per cent, water paints for 3 per cent, and unclassified sales for 10 per cent.
