SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS, MARCH, 1947

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$6,588,378 in March, 1947, compared with \$5,378,839 in February, 1947. In March, 1947 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 53 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 33 per cent, water paints for 2 per cent, and unclassified sales for 12 per cent.

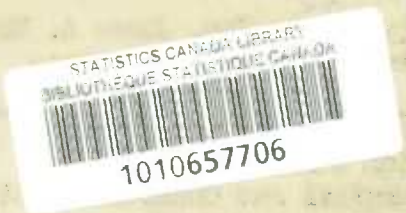
