

## SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS, JUNE, 1947

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to $\$ 6,851,917$ in June, 1947, compared with $\$ 6,706,916$ in May, 1947. In June, 1947, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 50 per cent of the total; industrial sales for 35 per cent; water paints for 2 per cent, and unclassified sales for 13 per cent.
