## SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS, PSEPTEMBER, 1947

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to $\$ 5,586,300$ in September, 1947 compared with $\$ 5,806,373$ in August, 1947. In September, 1947 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 50 per cent of the total; industrial sales for 38 per cent; water paints for 3 per cent, and unclassified sales for 9 per cent.
