SALEC OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS, JANUARY, 1948

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to $\$ 6,538,574$ in January, 1948 compared with $\$ 4,753,071$ in January, 1947. In January, 1948, the trade sales, exclusive of water paints, accounted for about 52 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 31 per cent, and water paints for 2 per cent, and unclassified sales for 15 per cent.
