## SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

## OCTOBER - 1948

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian Production, amounted to \$5,838,629 in October, 1948, compared with \$6,352,437 in October, 1947. In October, 1948 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 44 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 40 per cent, water paints for 2 per cent, and unclassified sales for 14 per cent.
