## SALES OF PAIMTS, VAZHSSHES AID LACQUERS

## NOVEMBER, 1948 (Corrected Statement)

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian Production, amounted to $\$ 5,765,737$ in November, 1948, compared with $55,717,284$ in lovember, 1947. In November, 1948 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 45 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 40 per cent, water paints for 2 per cent, and unclassified sales for 13 per cent.
