SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

JUNE, 1948

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$8,369,928 in June, 1948, compared with \$6,876,573 in June, 1947. In June, 1948 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 51 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 32 per cent, water paints for 2 per cent, and unclassified sales for 15 per cent.
