SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

JULY, 1948 (Revised)

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$6,786,676 in July, 1948, compared with \$5,777,486 in July, 1947. In July, 1948 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 49 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 36 per cent, water paints for 1 per cent, and unclassified sales for 14 per cent.
