SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERSJANUARY, 1949

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$5,539,332 in January, 1949 compared with \$6,538,374 in January, 1948. In January, 1949, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 52 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 35 per cent, water paints for 4 per cent, and unclassified sales for 9 per cent.
