Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Camadian production, amounted to $\$ 5,539,332$ in January, 1949 compared with $\$ 6,538,374$ in January, 1948. In January, 1949, the trade saler (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 52 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 35 per cent, water paints for 4 per cent, and unclassified sales for 9 por corot.
