Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$6,157,584 in February, 1949, compared with \$5,566,626 in January. In February, 1949, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 50 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 36 per cent, water paints for 2 per cent, and unclassified sales for 12 per cent.
