Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cant of the total Canadian production, amounted to $\$ 6,157,584$ in February, 1949, compared with $\$ 5,566,626$ in January. In February, 1949, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 50 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 36 per cent, water paints for 2 per cent, and unclassified sales for 12 per cent.
