## SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

## MAY - 1949

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$8,680,104 in May, 1949, compared with \$8,000,897 in April, 1949. In May, 1949, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 55 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 30 per cent, water paints for 2 per cent, and unclassified sales for 13 per cent.
