

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the iotal Canadian production, amounted to $\$ 8,722,179$ in June, 1949, compared with $\$ 8,680,104$ in May, 1949. In June, 1949, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 52 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 32 per cent, water paints for 1 per cent, and unclassified sales for 15 per cent.
