

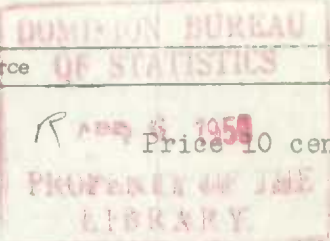

SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERSJANUARY - 1950

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production, amounted to \$5,536,665 in January, 1950, compared with \$5,566,626 in January, 1949.
