SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

OCTOBER - 1950

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production amounted to \$7,633,954 in October 1950 compared with \$6,039,078 in 1949. In October 1950, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 47 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 39 per cent, water paints for 5 per cent, and unclassified sales for 9 per cent.
