## SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

## NOVEMBER - 1950

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production amounted to $\$ 7,360,803$ in November, 1950 compared with $\$ 5,546,831$ in 1949. In November, 1950, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 49 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 38 per cent, water paints for 3 per cent, and unclassified sales for 10 per cent.
