SAIES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND IACQUERS

## JUNE - 1950

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production amounted to $\$ 9,281,580$ in June, 1950 compared with $\$ 8,705,487$ in May. In June, 1950 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 56 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 31 per cent, water paints for 5 per cent, and unclassified sales for 8 per cent.
