## SALES OF PAINTS, VARHISFES AND LACQUERS

## AUGUST - 1950

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production amounted to $\$ 8,656,676$ in August, 1950 compared with $\$ 6,818,867$ in 1949. In August, 1950, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 55 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 32 per cent, water paints for 4 per cent, and unclassified sales for 9 per cent.
