MARCH - 1951

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production amounted to $\$ 8,171,505$ in Warch, 1951 compared with $\$ 6,439,580$ in March, 1950. The trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 53 per cent of the total, industrial salos for 40 per cent, water paints for 4 per cent, and unclassified sales for 3 per cent, in harch, 1951.
