## SALFS OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

## OCTOBER - 1952

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production amounted to $\$ 8,230,597$ in October, 1952, compared with $\$ 7,213,130$ in 1951. In October, 1952, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 49 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 38 per cent, water paints for 10 per cent, and unclassified sales for 3 per cent.
