SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

FEBRUARY - 1952

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production amounted to \$7,482,921 in February, 1952 compared with \$7,618,290 in 1951. In February, 1952, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 52 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 38 per cent, water paints for 7 per cent, and unclassified sales for 3 per cent.
