SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS

MARCH - 1952

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production amounted to \$3,280,084 in March, 1952, compared with \$8,171,505 in 1951. In March, 1952, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 50 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 36 per cent, water paints for 9 per cent, and unclassified sales for 5 per cent.
