SALES OF PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERSJULY - 1952

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production amounted to \$9,321,712 in July, 1952, compared with \$8,695,562 in 1951. In July, 1952, the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 54 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 34 per cent, water paints for 5 per cent, and unclassified sales for 7 per cent.
