## FEERUARY - 1953

Sales of paints, varnishes and lacquers by manufacturers, which normally account for 96 per cent of the total Canadian production amounted to $\$ 8,587,572$ in February, 1953, compared with $\$ 7,470,955$ in 1952. In February, 1953 the trade sales (exclusive of water paints) accounted for about 48 per cent of the total, industrial sales for 39 per cent, water paints for 2 per cent, latex emulsion for 6 per cent, and unclassified sales for 5 per cent.
