SOAPS AND SYNTHETIC DETERGENTS

Factory shipments of soaps and synthetic detergents by principal Canadian producers were valued at \$5,139,901 during October, 1954. Soaps accounted for \$2,063,579 or 40.1 per cent of this total, while synthetic detergents accounted for \$3,076,322 or 59.9 per cent. The shipments for October, 1954, included 1,232,907 pounds of bar laundry and household soaps at \$209,079; 547,366 pounds of soap chips and flakes in household packages at \$89,650; 2,589,242 pounds of toilet soaps in bars at \$784,311 and 3,812,637 pounds of soap powders in household packages at \$740,273. Shipments of synthetic detergents in household packages totalled 10,207,519 pounds at \$2,797,031 during the same period.
