SOAPS AND SYNTHETIC DETERGENTS

Factory shipments of soaps and synthetic detergents by principal Canadian producers were valued at \$5,102,036 during November, 1954. Soaps accounted for \$2,441,988 or 48 per cent of this total, while synthetic detergents accounted for \$2,660,048 or 52 The shipments for November, 1954, included 1,509,645 pounds of bar laundry and household soaps at \$251,548; 705,848 pounds of soap chips and flakes in household packages at \$114,338; 3,111,915 pounds of toilet soaps in bars at \$911,055 and 4,377,423 pounds of soap powders in household packages at \$855,803. Shipments of synthetic detergents in household packages totalled 8,578,638 pounds at \$2,402,144 during the same period.
