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SOAPS AND SYNTHETIC DETERGENTS

Factory shipments of soaps and synthetic detergents by principal Canadian producers were valued at \$3,907,219 during December, 1954. Soaps accounted for \$1,799,811 or 46 per cent of this total, while synthetic detergents accounted for \$2,107,408 or 54 per cent. The shipments for December, 1954, included 1,393,145 pounds of bar laundry and household soaps at \$232,556; 806,400 pounds of soap chips and flakes in household packages at \$131,873; 2,131,580 pounds of toilet soaps in bars at \$629,758 and 2,847,233 pounds of soap powders in household packages at \$600,105. Shipments of synthetic detergents in household packages totalled 6,856,735 pounds at \$1,925,041 during the same period.
