SOAPS AND SYNTHETIC DETERGENTS

Factory shipments of soaps and synthetic detergents by principal Canadian producers were valued at \$4,675,956 during March, 1954. Scaps accounted for \$2,347,597 or 50 per cent of this total, while synthetic detergents accounted for \$2,328,359 or 50 per cent. The shipments for March, 1954, included 1,079,602 pounds of bar laundry and household soaps at \$191,743; 891,375 pounds of soap chips and flakes in household packages at \$156,516; 2,922,225 pounds of toilet scaps in bars at \$894,175; and 4,811,617 pounds of scap powders in household packages at \$919,832. Shipments of synthetic detergents in household packages totalled 8,066,468 pounds at \$2,150,194 during the same period.
