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## SOAPS AND SYNTHETIC DETERGENTS

Factory shipments of soaps and synthetic detergents by principal Canadian producers were valued at \$4,659,419 during August, 1954. Soaps accounted for \$2,173,993 or 46.6 per cent of this total, while synthetic detergents accounted for \$2,485,426 or 53.4 per cent. The shipments for August, 1954, included 1,357,966 pounds of bar laundry and household soaps at \$225,978; 661,838 pounds of soap chips and flakes in household packages at \$107,788; 3,118,296 pounds of toilet soaps in bars at \$935,846 and 3,253,025 pounds of soap powders in household packages at \$674,599. Shipments of synthetic detergents in household packages totalled 8,692,081 pounds at \$2,157,600 during the same period.
