SOAPS AND SYNTHETIC DETERGENTS

Factory shipments of soaps and synthetic detergents by principal Canadian producers were valued at \$4.891,085 during February, 1955. Soaps accounted for \$2,152,784 or 44 per cent of this total, while synthetic detergents accounted for \$2,738,301 or 56 per cent. The shipments for February, 1955, included 1,299,316 pounds of bar laundry and household soaps at \$218,630; 748,218 pounds of soap chips and flakes in household packages at \$113,134; 3,176,125 pounds of toilet soaps in bars at \$902,200; and 3,813,559 pounds of soap powders in household packages at \$757,293. Shipments of synthetic detergents in household packages totalled 8.348.840 pounds at \$2,237,500 during the same period.
