SOAPS AND SYNTHETIC DETERGENTS

Factory shipments of sosps and synthetic detergents by principal Canadian producers were valued at \$4,499,816 during April, 1955. Soaps accounted for \$1,984,447 or 44 per cent of this total, while synthetic detergents accounted for \$2,515,369 or 56 per cent. The shipments for April, 1955, included 1,452,900 pounds of bar laundry and household soaps at \$238,874; 469,935 pounds of soap chips and flakes in household packages at \$81,029; 2,617,085 pounds of toilet soaps in bars at \$812,952; and 3,175,250 pounds of soap powders in household packages at \$626,303. Shipments of synthetic detergents in household packages totalled 7,598,136 pounds at \$2,072,827 during the same period.
