CAR LOADINGS
(Sixth Week ended February 11th, 1933)

No. 6

Car loadings for the week ended February 11th amounted to 30,691 cars, as compared with 31,911 cars for the previous week and 31,437 cars for the fourth week. The very low temperature which was more or less general over all of Canada for most of the week was undoubtedly the main reason for the decrease instead of the usual increase. The index number dropped from 55.93 for the previous week to 53.22 which is a new low record for the past two years.

Loadings in the western division were particularly light, dropping from 11,202 cars for the fifth week to 10,314 cars, and the index number dropped from 57.96 to 52.80. Grain decreased by 856 cars, merchandise by 325 cars and miscellaneous freight by 189 cars while coal increased by 842 cars and coke by 102 cars.


In the eastern division total loadings amounted to 20,377 cars which was 332 cars less than for the previous week. This depressed the index number from 54.57 to 53.41. Miscellaneous freight, which is largely manufactures, decreased by 605 cars, grain by 240 cars and coal by 160 cars. Coke increased by 401 cars, pulp and paper by 170 cars and merchandise by 126 cars.


