The holiday on July lst affected the car loadings for the week ended July 3rd. whioh were 7,422 cars less than the total for the previcus week. Coke, pulpwood and ore were the only commodities to show increases; the deorease of 1,363 cars of grain was more or less seasonal but the other decreases inoluding 2,526 cars of merchandise and 2,218 cars of miscellaneous freight were undoubtedly the effeot of the holiday.
