Car loadings for the meek ended December 17 showed an increase over the previcus week's of 967 cars. Coal increased by 853 cars, pulpwood by 742 cars, merchandise by 290 cars and miscellaneous freight by 296 cars. Wheat was lighter by 601 cars and other forest products by 568 cars.

Compared with last year's loadings, the increase was 4,129 cars, wheat being heavier by 4,381 cars, live stock by 377 cars and merchandise by 444 cars. Coal decreased by 630 cars, lumber by 355 cars and miscellaneous freight by 676 cars.
