Car loadings for the week ended July 2 were affected by the holidays on July 1 and 2, showing decreases of 12,704 cars from the previous week's loadings and 4,744 cars from last year's loadings.

Grain was lighter than in 1926 by 299 cars, live stock by 418 cars, pulp wood by 564 cars, other forest products by 467 cars, merchandise by 965 cars and miscellaneous freight by 1,528 cars.
