MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS

Quarterly Report(1) for Period April 1 to June 30, 1954.

There were 43,612 motor vehicle traffic accidents reported under legislative requirements during the second quarter of 1954. Of the total 460 were fatal accidents; 9,809 were injury accidents and in 33,343 cases only property damage occurred.

During the first half of 1954 there were 102,362 accidents of which 356 were fatal and 17,902 involved personal injury. Excluding Quebec the total of 65,780 accidents for the rest of Canada shows only a small rise from 64,726 in the first six months of 1953. During 1953 data for suebec were not available but comparison between the other nine provinces and the territories shows that the number of deaths rose from 714 to 717 in the interval while persons injured fell 1,105 from 19,999 to 18,394.

Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia had less accidents in the first six months of 1954 but in the other provinces and in the territories, the total number of accidents showed an increase. The number of deaths was down in Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Saskatchewan, Alberta and the Yukon and Northwest Territories. Fewer people were injured in Nova Scotia, Ontario, and the four Western provinces. A comparison of cumulative totals by provinces is given on page 4.
