# MOTOR VEHICLE TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

(Period July 1 to September 30, 1955)

Motor vehicle traffic accidents reported by nine provinces, (excluding Quebec), and the Territories for July, August and September, 1955 numbered 36,601 of which 581 were fatal, 10,227 non-fatal injury accidents and those resulting in property damage only totalled 25,793. During the three months 677 persons were killed and 15,551 injured.

Nova Scotia, Ontario, Saskatchewan, Alberta and the Territories all showed increases in the number of accidents reported during the quarter compared with the same period in 1954. Ontario accidents increased to 16,666 from 14,567 one year ago.

Nova Scotia was the only province to record a decrease in the number of persons killed. This province reported 36 persons killed in the third quarter of 1955 as compared with 49 for the same period of 1954. Prince Edward Island and the Territories reported fewer persons injured during the quarter compared with 1954.

The first nine months of 1955 resulted in a total of 99,507 accidents reported by nine provinces and the Territories (excluding Quebec) compared with 100,563 in the same period of 1954. The number of persons killed was 1,475 as against 1,288 one year ago and persons injured increased to 35,736 from 32,585 in the January - September period of 1954.
