

PRICE INDEX NUMBERS OF COMMODITIES AND SERVICES USED BY FARMERS (1935-39=100)

AUGUST, 1948

Increases in equipment and materials prices, farm wage rates and farm family living costs advanced the Dominion composite index of commodities and prvices used by farmers 6.0 points between April and August, 1948. At 189.2 the August index was 23.6 points higher than that for August, 1947. Exclusive of living costs, the Dominion composite index rose 6.1 points between April and August, and 23.9 points in the year.

For all Canada, equipment and materials prices advanced 4.1 points from April to August; farm wage rates were up 21.0 points and farm family living costs 5.8 points. Regional index numbers for eastern and western Canada showed the following point increases respectively: equipment and materials, 2.6 and 5.6; wage rates, 23.8 and 17.0; living costs. 5.0 and 6.7.



The four main series entering the Dominion composite index are shown below. together with the composite index, inclusive and exclusive of living costs:

APPENDIX ON METHOD OF CONSTRUCTION OF

"PRICE INDEX NUMBERS OF COMMODITIES AND SERVICES USED BY FARMERS"

The composite index of prices of commodities and services used by farmers consists of four parts: Equipment and Materials, Tax and Interest Rates, Farm Wage Rates and Farm Family Living Costs. Separate indexes are made for Eastern and Western Canada, and the final totals combined into a Dominion index. The series, Equipment and Materials and Farm Family Living Costs, are available back to 1913; Farm Wage Rates and Tax Rates to 1914; and Interest Rates to 1917.

The weights are based upon several sources, chief of which are the results of a 1938 survey of 1,692 farm families, in which farmers reported spending about 40 per cent of operating outlay for living expenses and the remaining 60 per cent for direct operating costs. Capital expenditures, such as land and live stock, were recorded but have not been represented in these index numbers.

Prices for implements are obtained from price lists issued by manufacturers of this equipment. Building materials' prices are collected from selected retail sources serving farm communities. Gasolene, oil, grease and kerosene prices also come from retailers in farm communities. Farmurs are exempt from certain taxes on these petroleum items. Fertilizer, seed and binder twine prices are obtained from large firms or organizations supplying these items. Feed and hardware are priced three times a year in centres where farmers deal.

Tax rates are calculated from a special sample of rural municipality records giving assessed land valuations and comparable total amounts of land taxes levied. They are revised once a year.

Mortgage interest rates are computed from farm crop correspondents' returns, indicating the prevailing level of rates in farm communities.

wage rates are provided three times a year by crop correspondents reporting to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Agricultural Division. They are average wages of male farm help, quoted on both "with board" and "without board" bases and including seasonal help.

The farm family living cost price data are obtained by direct and questionnaires addressed thrice yearly to grocers and other retailers in a cross-country sample of rural towns. Mail-order catalogues are reliad upon to a large extent for clothing and sundry prices.

The price index series, Commodities and Services Used by Farmers exclusive of Living Costs, 1914-1948, appears on page 5 of this bullotin. A complete record of all other series, together with the weighting system used, is available in Frice Index Numbers of Commodities and Services Used by Farmers, 1913-1948, Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Ottawa, July 21, 1945.
