## NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES IN CAITADA MN AFRIL, 1934.

Sales at retail of new passenger cars, trucks and buses reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for April, 1934, show an increase of $98 . \mathrm{F}_{0}$. in numbers and $110 \%$ in values, as compared with April, 1933. There was a total of 12,083 vehicles sold for $\$ 12,606,297$ in April, 8,379 for $\$ 8,395,740$ in March, and 6,078 for $\$ 6,003,920$ in April, 1933.

New passenger cars sold numbered 10,630 in April, 7,540 in March and 5,495 in April, 1933. Their retail values amounted to $111,099,404$ in April, $\$ 7,549,262$ in March, and \$5,426,224 in April, 1933 .

There were 1, 453 trucks and buses sold in April, 839 in March and 583 in spril last year, and they were valued at $\$ 1,506,893, \$ 846,478$ and $\$ 577,696$ respectively.

These statistics have been compiled from reports of nineteen companies whose sales comprise over $90 \%$ of total Canadian sales. The retail value used is the price paid by an individual purchaser at the Canadian point of manufacture and includes sales and excise taxes, charge for standard accessorics, dealer's commission, etc. Freight charges from Canadian point of manufacture to point of delivery have been excluded. Duty is included in the retail value of imported cars.
