NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES IN CANADA IN JANUARY, 1935.


Retail sales of new passenger cars, trucks and buses in Canada in January, 1935, show an increase of 62.2% in number and 65.6% in value as compared with January, 1934. There were 3,456 new vehicles sold for \$3,505,028 in January, 2,182 for \$2,357,674 in December and 2,131 for \$2,116,095 in January, 1934.

New passenger cars numbered 2,850 in January this year, 1,649 in December and 1,875 in January last year with corresponding retail values of \$2,863,880, \$1,745,000 and \$1,815,612 respectively. There were 606 trucks and buses sold for \$641,148 in January, 533 for \$612,674 in December and 256 for \$300,483 in January, 1934.

These figures are compiled by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics from returns made by twenty-two companies in 1935 and 1934 and by nine teen companies in 1933.

Through the co-operation of the reporting firms, it has now been possible to add a new series of monthly figures showing the sales in each province from Quebec westward and for the Maritime provinces combined. Provincial figures have been prepared for the year 1934 and will be issued monthly for the current year. While the lack of historical data makes it impossible to make detailed comparisons, it is believed that the provincial figures will reveal interesting regional differences in motor vehicle sales.

The figures for January 1934 and 1935 show that the bulk of the sales in this month is made in Ontario. This preponderance of purchasing, however, tends to grow somewhat less as the season advances, according to the figures available for 1934.

The shift of buying from one month to another in any year would affect year to year comparisons. This factor may influence the figures given below although the series is, at present, too short to make any accurate analysis.
