Sales of New Motor Vehicles

Sales of new motor vehicles in January 1950 scared to an unusually high level for that month as most manufacturers introduced new models in large volume. New vehicle sales numbered 26,593 units with a retail value of \$53,714,978, an increase of 131% in number and 118% in value over January 1949 when there was a curtailment of distribution of passenger cars by most manufacturers resulting in sales of only 11,492 new vehicles with a retail value of \$24,677,689.

Passenger car sales, with a gain of 235% in number, were entirely responsible for the major gain over January 1949. The increase in number of trucks sold amounted to 10% while a decrease was registered in number of buses sold. Passenger car sales numbered 20,809 units compared with 6,216 units in January 1949, while truck sales numbered 5.749 units compared with 5.221 in the same month a year ago.

Large increases in total number of vehicles sold occurred in all parts of the country. The greatest gain was recorded in British Columbia where the number of new motor vehicles sold was 202% in excess of the January 1949 total. Sales in Quebec registered an increase of 153% while the Ontario gain amounted to 128%. The Maritime Provinces, Saskatchewan, Alberta, and Manitoba followed with increases of 130%, 111%, 101%, and 88% respectively.

Financing of Motor Vehicle Sales

New and used vehicles financed in January 1950 numbered 14,785 with a financed value of \$14,326,070, an increase of 59% in number of vehicles and 54% in amount of financing over January 1949 when 9,292 new

The volume number, used for the first time in this issue, signifies the number of years for which these statistics have been compiled. Previous issues in this series may be identified by publication number 16-3010 (Sales) and 16-4070 (Financing). and used vehicles were financed to the extent of \$9,278,742.

New Vehicles--There were 6,140 new motor vehicles financed for \$8,449,534 in January 1950, 69% in number and 61% in amount above the January 1949 totals of 3,635 new vehicles financed for an amount of \$5,254,917. Financing of passenger cars was mainly responsible for the large increase in the total of new vehicles financed. There were 4,563 passenger cars financed in January this year, 98% more than in the same month of 1949, while the number of commercial vehicles financed increased only 19% over January a year ago.

The largest increase in number of new vehicles financed by provinces was reported for Manitoba with a gain of 147%, while the Maritime Provinces recorded the lowest increase, 27%. Gains for the other provinces ranged from 49% to 77%.

Used Vehicles--Financing of used vehicles in January 1950 was higher by 55% in number and 46% in value than in January 1949. There were 8,645 used vehicles financed for \$5,876,536 in January this year compared with 5,657 vehicles with a financed value of \$4,023,825 in January a year ago. Of these, passenger cars numbered 7,103 and had a financed value of \$4,639,672, up 59% in number and 56% in value from the 4,476 used passenger cars financed for \$2,971,306 in January 1949. Financing of used commercial vehicles registered an increase of 31% in number and 18% in amount of financing.

Manitoba and Saskatchewan marked up the widest gains over January 1949 in number of used vehicles financed with increases of 163% and 133% respectively. Quebec came next with an increase of 98% followed by the Maritime Provinces where the number of used vehicles financed was up 66%. Other gains were as follows: Ontario, 45%; British Columbia, 36%; and Alberta, 12%.
