NEW MOTOR VEHICLES SALESANDMOTOR VEHICLE FINANCINGNOVEMBER 1951New Motor Vehicle Sales

The decline in sales of new motor vehicles continued in November. There were 21,929 new vehicles sold in November, down 33% in number from the 32,752 units sold in the same month last year. The retail value of these vehicles was \$55,526,073, 22% below the 1950 figure of \$71,365,769. In the eleven-month period ending with November, 364,957 new vehicles were sold compared with 400,367 during the same period last year.

The sale of new passenger cars was responsible for the decline in November. The number of new cars sold decreased 45% from the same month last year and the retail value was 35% lower than in November 1950. Declines in passenger car sales occurred in all provinces but was most acute in British Columbia, where sales were 54% lower than last year. There was a decrease in retail value in all provinces from 1950 with the exception of Saskatchewan which showed an increase of 3%. New commercial vehicles increased 3% in number sold and the retail value of November sales was 19% above November last year.

Note: Retail values quoted in this report are based on the retail price to individual purchasers at the Canadian point of manufacture. In the case of imported vehicles, the values are the retail price delivered at the nearest Canadian distributing centre. Retail values include sales and excise taxes, charges for standard accessories, dealers' commissions, etc. Transportation charges from Canadian point of manufacture to point of delivery are not included.

The heading "Commercial Vehicles" used in the main tables of this report represents the combined sales of trucks and buses. Sales of buses in November are shown separately in the following table.

#### Financing of Motor Vehicle Sales

New Vehicles - The number of new motor vehicles sales financed, while lower in November this year than last, did not decline as sharply as sales. The 10,041 new vehicles financed represented a 10% decrease from November 1950 but the amount of financing increased 5% over last year.

Most provinces recorded less financing of passenger cars, both in number and amount of financing, parallelling the sharper reduction in sales of new passenger cars. Financing of commercial vehicles, however, showed substantial gains over November 1950 in all provinces, except Manitoba, where the number financed was 5% lower.


Used Vehicles - The financing of used vehicles remained high during November. Both the number of units and the amount of financing was greater in all provinces as compared with the same month of last year. Used passenger cars financed numbered 18,465, 24% more than in November 1950. The number of used commercial vehicles financed increased 69% from 3,589 to 6,078 and the amount of financing was 65% above the corresponding period of last year.


