NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES AND MOTOR VEHICLE FINANCING
OCTOBER 1956

New Motor Vehicle Sales

There were 25,446 new passenger cars sold in October for a retail value of \$68,962,000, a decrease of 3 per cent in number and 5 per cent in value over the 26,135 units sold in October 1955 for \$72,630,000. The number of units sold was down in Manitoba, Ontario and British Columbia. The value of sales decreased in these same provinces and also in Saskatchewan. Among the provinces which registered an increase, Newfoundland was outstanding while significant gains occurred in New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island.

New commercial vehicles sold in October 1956 numbered 8,073, an increase of 11 per cent over the 7,283 sold in the same month last year. The value of sales increased 30 per cent to \$27,695,000 from \$21,356,000 over the same period. Provincially, Manitoba, Nova Scotia and Ontario registered a drop in the number of units sold but the value of sales was down only in Manitoba. Included in the above figures were 41 buses valued at \$456,000.

New passenger cars and commercial vehicles combined were only slightly higher than in October 1955, with 33,519 units retailed for \$96,657,000.

Notes:

Retail values quoted in this report are based on the retail price to individual purchasers at the Canadian point of manufacture. In the case of imported vehicles, the values are the retail price delivered at the nearest Canadian distributing centre. Retail values include sales and excise taxes, charges for standard accessories, dealers' commissions, etc. Transportation charges from Canadian point of manufacture to point of delivery are not included.

The financing shown herein represents only that business done by sales finance and acceptance companies engaged in the purchase or discounting of notes receivable arising from retail instalment sales of new and used motor vehicles.

Financing of Motor Vehicle SalesNew Vehicles

In October 1956, sales finance and acceptance companies handled the financing of 15,621 new passenger cars for an amount of \$33,174,000. The number of new passenger cars financed was 27 per cent greater than the 12,266 financed a year ago while the amount financed increased 36 per cent from \$24,338,000. These increases were shared by all ten provinces with British Columbia, Alberta and Quebec in the lead.

Commercial vehicle sales financing in this period amounted to \$10,152,000 and covered 3,294 units. These figures were respectively 60 and 25 per cent greater than their levels in October 1955.

Used Vehicles

The financing of used passenger cars and used commercial vehicles amounted to \$31,350,000, an increase of 21 per cent over the \$25,944,000 reported for October 1955. In the same period the number of used vehicles financed increased 11 per cent to 35,883 units from 32,268 in the previous year. Of these totals, passenger car financing accounted for \$26,973,000 and 30,915 units which were respectively 22 and 13 per cent greater than a year ago.



1956/1955


