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DEFINITIONS

An establishment is classified as an hotel and included in this survey only if it fits into one of the following categories:

Full Year Hotels, Licensed:

Establishments with six or more rooms providing lodging or lodgings and meals for transient guests and licensed to sell beer, wine, or liquor. To be considered a full year hotel, an establishment must be operated for at least ten months in the year.

Full Year Hotels, Non-Licensed:

Establishments having the qualifications mentioned above, but which do not sell alcoholic beverages.

Seasonal Hotels, Licensed:

Establishments with six or more rooms providing lodging or lodgings and meals for transient guests, licensed to sell beer, wine, or liquor and open less than ten months of the year. Generally, the establishment must have six or more rooms in the main lodge but an exception is made in the case of resort hotels where the sleeping accommodation is provided in the form of cabins or cottages but a central dining room, administration, and entertainment facilities are provided in the main lodge.

Seasonal hotels include such businesses as resort hotels, hunting or fishing lodges, ski lodges or chalets, and dude ranches.

Seasonal Hotels, Non-Licensed:

Establishments having the qualifications listed for seasonal hotels above but which do not sell alcoholic beverages.

INTRODUCTION

The 1951 survey of hotels formed a part of the decennial Census of Distribution and an enumeration of this type of service was made along with all other Canadian businesses. The inclusion of an establishment in this survey was based on the definitions

given on the opposite page. Apartment hotels, tourist homes, staff houses, private clubs, rooming or boarding houses, and public houses are not included in this report.

SUMMARY OF OPERATIONS

Hotels in operation in Canada during 1951 numbered 5,092 with 146,441 rooms compared with 5,169 in 1950 which had 146,353 rooms. Total receipts in 1951 amounted to \$357,282,000, an increase of 11% over the 1950 receipts of \$322,390,000.

The 3,175 full year hotels licensed to sell beer, wine, and or liquor had receipts of \$307,639,000 in

1951, 86% of total receipts of all hotels. Of the 1,014 seasonal hotels operating in 1951 only 197 were licensed to sell alcoholic beverages but these had receipts of \$9,863,000 compared with receipts of \$10,826,000 handled by the 817 non-licensed seasonal hotels.

The greatest portion of the 1951 receipts was derived from the sale of beer, wine, and liquor—50.6%. Rental of rooms accounted for 23.3% of total receipts, sales of meals 17.7%, and all other sources 8.4%. This distribution of receipts showed little variation from that of 1950. Again, hotels in the Prairie Provinces reported the highest portion of receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages (over 60%). Throughout this report figures for British Columbia include the Yukon and Northwest Territories.

The 146,441 rooms available in Canadian hotels in 1951, had a bed capacity of 257,657 and a percentage occupancy of 58%. Hotels engaged a minimum of 45,916 and a maximum of 63,118 employees in 1951 and these received \$80,382,000 in salaries and wages. The \$352,907,000 shown in Table 4 as total operating receipts of all hotels does not include non-operating revenue derived from leased concessions and commercial rentals, interest on investments, etc.

Tables 5 and 6 showing source of receipts and expenses for 1951 are presented somewhat differently than in previous years. Non-operating revenue appears as a separate item under receipts and cost of goods sold is presented apart from operating expenses. A direct comparison of 1951 expenses with those for 1949 and 1950 can only be arrived at by combining the 1951 figures for total operating expenses and cost of goods sold. This has been done in tables 7 and 8 where total expenses are shown as percentages of total receipts. Expressed percentage wise, ex-

penses were only fractionnaly higher for both incorporated and unincorporated hotels in 1951 as compared with 1950. Incorporated seasonal hotels, both licensed and non-licensed, showed a slightly higher margin of profit in 1951 than in 1950.

Toronto hotels led those of all other Canadian cities in volume of receipts handled in 1951, followed by Montreal, Vancouver, and Winnipeg. Montreal hotels placed first in amount of receipts from room rentals while Toronto hotels led in the amount of revenue obtained from sales of meals and beer, wine and liquor. The highest percentage of room occupancy—81%, was recorded by hotels in Toronto, Halifax and Saint John.

Hotels with receipts of \$100,000 or more numbered 805 or 16% of all hotels but accounted for 61% of total receipts. Most of the large hotels were concentrated in the full year licensed class and 66% of all Canadian hotels were licensed to sell some type of alcoholic beverage in 1951.

Table 12 reveals that there were more hotels with 11 to 25 rooms than any other room-size classification, and this category obtained the highest portion of total receipts. Only 12 hotels in Canada had over 500 rooms in 1951.

The percentage of room occupancy was higher in the larger hotels than in the smaller ones. Hotels with 201 to 500 rooms had the highest rate at 75% while hotels with 10 rooms or less reported only 31% occupancy.
