

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## DEFINITIONS

An establishment is classified as an hotel and included in this survey only if it fits into one of the following categories:

**Full Year Hotels, Licensed:**

Establishments with six or more rooms providing lodging or lodgings and meals for transient guests and licensed to sell beer, wine, or liquor. To be considered a full year hotel, an establishment must be operated for at least ten months in the year.

**Full Year Hotels, Non-Licensed:**

Establishments having the qualifications mentioned above, but which do not sell alcoholic beverages.

**Seasonal Hotels, Licensed:**

Establishments with six or more rooms providing lodging or lodgings and meals for transient guests, licensed to sell beer, wine, or liquor and open less than ten months of the year. Generally, the establishment must have six or more rooms in the main lodge but an exception is made in the case of resort hotels where the sleeping accommodation is provided in the form of cabins or cottages but a central dining room, administration, and entertainment facilities are provided in the main lodge.

Seasonal hotels include such businesses as resort hotels, hunting or fishing lodges, ski lodges or chalets, and dude ranches.

**Seasonal Hotels, Non-Licensed:**

Establishments having the qualifications listed for seasonal hotels above but which do not sell alcoholic beverages.

# HOTELS, 1952

## Summary of Operations

Canada's hotel business amounted to \$391,936,000 in 1952, representing an increase of 10% over the 1951 receipts of \$357,282,000. The number of hotels in operation increased from 5,092 with 146,441 rooms in 1951 to 5,157 with 149,615 rooms in 1952.

The 3,253 full year hotels licensed to sell beer, wine and/or liquor had receipts of \$344,476,000 in

1952, 88% of the total receipts of all hotels. Only 191 of the 1,018 seasonal hotels operating in 1952 were licensed to sell alcoholic beverages but these had receipts of \$9,944,000 compared with receipts of \$11,362,000 handled by the 827 non-licensed seasonal hotels.

The sale of beer, wine and liquor accounted for 51.5% of the total receipts in 1952, rental of rooms for 22.9%, sales of meals for 17.2% and all other sources for 8.4%. This distribution of receipts showed little variation from that of 1951. Hotels in the Prairie Provinces obtained over 60% of their income from the sale of alcoholic beverages. Throughout this report figures for British Columbia include the Yukon and Northwest Territories.

There were 149,615 rooms available in Canadian hotels in 1952 with a bed capacity of 263,357 and a percentage occupancy of 58%. Hotels employed an average of 58,348 persons in 1952 and paid out \$88,747,000 in salaries and wages.

Tables 5 and 6 show sources of receipts and expenses while in tables 7 and 8 expenses are shown as percentages of total receipts. Expressed percentage wise, total expenses were slightly lower in 1952 than in 1951 for all incorporated and unincorporated hotels with the exception of seasonal licensed hotels.

Toronto hotels with receipts of \$26,334,000 led those of all other Canadian cities in the volume of business handled in 1952. Montreal placed second with receipts of \$22,354,000 followed by Vancouver with \$17,056,000 and Winnipeg with \$10,063,000. Montreal hotels obtained the highest income from room rentals, while Toronto hotels led in the amount of revenue derived from sales of meals and beer, wine and liquor. The highest percentage of room occupancy (85%) was reported by hotels in Halifax.

In table 10 hotels are classified according to number of rooms and nature of operations. This table reveals that there were more hotels with 11 to 25 rooms than any other room-size classification, and this category obtained the greatest portion of total receipts.

The larger hotels showed a higher percentage of occupancy than the smaller ones. Hotels in the 501 rooms and over class obtained the highest rate at 79% while hotels with 10 rooms or less reported only 29% occupancy.
