

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DEFINITIONS

An establishment is classified as an hotel and included in this survey only if it fits into one of the following categories:

Full Year Hotels, Licensed:

Establishments with six or more rooms providing lodging or lodgings and meals for transient guests and licensed to sell beer, wine, or liquor. To be considered a full year hotel, an establishment must be operated for at least ten months in the year.

Full Year Hotels, Non-Licensed:

Establishments having the qualifications mentioned above, but which do not sell alcoholic beverages.

Seasonal Hotels, Licensed:

Establishments with six or more rooms providing lodging or lodgings and meals for transient guests, licensed to sell beer, wine, or liquor and open less than ten months of the year. Generally, the establishment must have six or more rooms in the main lodge but an exception is made in the case of resort hotels where the sleeping accommodation is provided in the form of cabins or cottages but a central dining room, administration, and entertainment facilities are provided in the main lodge.

Seasonal hotels include such businesses as resort hotels, hunting or fishing lodges, ski lodges or chalets, and dude ranches.

Seasonal Hotels, Non-Licensed:

Establishments having the qualifications listed for seasonal hotels above but which do not sell alcoholic beverages.

HOTELS, 1954

In 1954 there were 5,208 hotels in operation, one less than the number reported in 1953. Receipts were \$405,856,000, down about one percent from the 1953 total of \$410,715,000. Working proprietors numbered 4,713, down 94 from the previous year. The average number of employees was 58,974, down 450. Salaries and wages were up slightly to \$98,695,000 from \$96,307,000 in 1953.

Making up the national change, receipts increased in Nova Scotia by 5.1%, decreased in Newfoundland by 10.3% and varied from the 1953 figure in other provinces by amounts within these limits. The number of hotels in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick decreased by 2% and 2.9% respectively but small increases in other provinces offset these decreases to leave the national total practically unchanged.

The number of rooms in hotels decreased slightly. The average room rate increased to \$3.81 from \$3.64 in 1953 and room occupancy decreased to 53% from 55%. The greatest percentage change in number of hotels and receipts occurred in the full year non-licensed group. The number of hotels decreased 4.1% and receipts decreased 16.9%. Receipts of full year licensed hotels accounted for 88.6% of the total receipts of hotels.

Tables 1 to 4 deal with the above statistics in detail.

Tables 5 and 6 are concerned with source of receipts and operating expenses. Although totals show small changes, a comparison with the previous year reveals

there has been some movement between and within these tables. Increased activity in incorporated hotels has partly offset the loss of business in unincorporated hotels. Within the incorporated category, increased business in licensed hotels has offset decreases in the business of the non-licensed group.

Tables 7 and 8 show the ratio of expenses to receipts. There is a tendency for expenses as a percentage of receipts to be up slightly from 1953. An exception to this is the results of incorporated seasonal hotels which improved their showing considerably.

Tables 9 to 12 deal with hotel statistics for selected cities and classifications of hotels by number of rooms with added detail on receipts and occupancy. Hotel receipts in Toronto were \$27,724,000, higher than in any other city. Receipts from the sale of beer, wine and liquor were highest in Toronto at \$9,114,000 but Montreal hotel room rentals were the highest in any Canadian city at \$9,593,000. Room occupancy was highest in Halifax at 84% and lowest in Sherbrooke at 49%. Estimated average daily room rate was highest in Montreal at \$7.20 (Toronto \$6.97) and lowest in Brantford at \$2.96. Hotels accounting for the largest part of total hotel revenue according to the classification in Table 11 were those in the 11-25 room class. Hotels with 501 rooms and over had the highest room occupancy. These figures do not show any significant change from the 1953 results. The remaining detail in these tables requires no explanation.


1954 HOTEL EXPENSES
