Revised Import Price and Volume Indexes

A new series of Import Price Indexes on a 1968 base supersedes the previous monthly series with the year 1948 as both weighting and reference base. After two decades, this series no longer adequately reflected the current position in Canadian import trade due to the introduction of many new products and to changes in volume, value, and patterns of commodity flow and the sources abroad of Canadian imports. With the passage of time, the 1948 series has thus become progressively less relevant for short-term analysis.

Although the year 1961 has been used as a common reference period for various DBS indexes, this base was considered not suitable for external trade indexes largely because of the conversion problems involved with the introduction at the beginning of 1961 of the new Export Commodity Classification and of the new Import Commodity Classification three years later. The year 1968 was selected as the new base period to reflect most appropriately current developments and trade patterns, including the substantial expansion in trade under the United States-Canada Automotive Products Agreement.

The value, price and volume indexes of imports are arranged according to the sections of the Import Commodity Classification. Sections I-V are fully represented in the indexes; but no price or volume indexes are calculated for Section VI (Special Trade Transactions) because of the relative insignificance and heterogeneous composition of this section.

The declared value indexes are based on the 1968 values for the sections of the above classification. The price index is based on a selection of representative individual commodities aggregated on the basis of the 1968 weighting diagram; and the volume index is derived by dividing the value index by the corresponding price index. A reference paper entitled "Export and Import Price Indexes, 1968 = 100," describing the methods of calculation will be published at a later date.
