



Travel Between Canada and the United States

November, 1957

1. Highway Traffic - November 1957

The volume of highway traffic crossing the border between Canada and the United States was between 1 and 2 per cent heavier in November than in the corresponding month of 1956. Total border crossings numbered 1,156,300 compared with 1,139,100 in the same month of last year, a gain of approximately 17,200 vehicles. Aggregate crossings were comprised of 542,400 foreign vehicles and 613,900 vehicles registered in Canada. There was an increase of 1 per cent in the number of foreign vehicles entering Canada, and an increase of nearly 2 per cent in the number of Canadian vehicles returning.

Cumulative data for the first eleven months of 1957 show a gain of 4 per cent in the volume of traffic crossing into Canada. The number of foreign vehicles entering Canada advanced 3 per cent over the same period of last year and a gain of 5 per cent was recorded in the number of Canadian units returning.

Foreign Travellers

Entries of foreign vehicles into Canada advanced by some 7,200 units when compared with November 1956. Foreign vehicles entering Canada consisted of 101,600 entries on travellers' vehicle permits, 403,700 non-permit or local entries and 37,100 commercial vehicles.

Entries on travellers' vehicle permits remained the same as in November 1956 when a record high for that month was established. Cumulative entries for January to November inclusive showed a gain of 3 per cent over the same period of last year, the increase amounting to some 64,500 crossings.

Entries of non-permit or local traffic increased 2 per cent over November 1956 and 3 per cent in the cumulative period. Entries of foreign commercial vehicles decreased 3 per cent in November 1957 when compared with the same month of last year but in the cumulative period, recorded a gain of between 1 and 2 per cent.

Canadian Vehicles

Re-entries of vehicles registered in Canada show an increase of 10,000 units when compared with November 1956. Returning Canadian vehicles comprised 85,400 units abroad over 24 hours, 481,500 units abroad 24 hours or less, and 47,000 commercial vehicles.

The volume of long-term traffic abroad more than 24 hours advanced 2 per cent in November. Cumulative data for the period January to November inclusive show a gain of more than 6 per cent in comparison with the same period of last year.

Short-term traffic abroad 24 hours or less advanced 3 per cent in November and 5 per cent in the first eleven months of 1957. Crossings of commercial vehicles registered in Canada decreased between 10 and 11 per cent in November and by less than 1 per cent in the cumulative period.

11. Traffic by Long Distance Common Carrier - October, 1957

Traffic crossing the border between Canada and the United States, by rail, bus, boat and plane declined 3 per cent when compared with October of last year. There was a decrease of 7 per cent in the number of foreign visitors entering Canada, while the number of returning Canadians remained practically unchanged. Cumulative data for the first ten months of 1957 show an increase of 3 per cent, compared to the same period of last year.

Foreign Travellers

The number of non-residents entering Canada by common carrier dropped from 89,900 in October 1956 to 83,500 in October 1957, or approximately 6,400 visits. Entries by rail and bus declined 15 per cent and 22 per cent respectively. Entries by boat were 8 per cent heavier, while entries by plane advanced between 9 and 10 per cent.

Cumulative data for the first ten months of 1957 show an increase of 6 per cent. There was a decrease in the number of arrivals by rail, but all other types of transportation recorded an increase, leaving a net gain for all types of common carrier.

Canadian Travellers

Residents of Canada returning from visits to the United States by common carrier numbered 105,800 in October 1957. This was a decline of some 100 visits when compared with October 1956. Re-entries by rail and boat decreased 15 per cent and 4 per cent respectively, while re-entries by bus and plane advanced 20 per cent and 4 per cent respectively.

Cumulative data for the period January to October 1957 show a small gain of 5,200 re-entries or 0.4 per cent. Re-entries by rail declined between 7 and 8 per cent, and by boat 8 per cent, when compared with the same period of 1956. However, gains of 4 per cent and 11 per cent in the number of re-entries by bus and plane, respectively, were sufficient to counter the decreases recorded in rail and boat travel, leaving a small net gain for the ten month period.




